**EPSE 441: Early Intervention for Infants and Young Children with Sensory Loss
and Motor Impairments (3.0)**
Course Outline

Course Description

This online course prepares students to develop and implement early intervention strategies for children who have vision and/or hearing loss, and motor disorders. Pre-requisites: All of EPSE 348, EPSE 406, EPSE 420

Intended Audience

This is a required course for students enrolled in the Infant Development/Supported Child Care Diploma Program. It is intended for ID consultants who work with children aged 0-3 in home, childcare, or pre-school settings; and SCC consultants who work with children in childcare and school settings. This course would also be appropriate for early childhood education/pre-school teachers, pediatric nurses, and rehabilitative therapists with a special interest in young children. Prospective students are expected to have completed a minimum of two years of college and/or university courses. Students in the ID/SCC diploma program must have completed EPSE 348 (Family-Centered Practice) EPSE 406 (Typical and Atypical Development in Infants and Young Children) and EPSE 420 (Assessment of Infants and Young Children with Special Needs) prior to enrolling in this course and have completed a survey or introductory course on infant and childcare development.

Course Overview

Lesson 1: Introduction to Early Intervention for Infants and Young Children with Sensory Loss and Motor Impairments

Lesson 2: Children with cerebral palsy

Lesson 3: Children with other motor conditions

Lesson 4: Children who are at risk or have secondary motor difficulties

Lesson 5: Children with visual impairment

Lesson 6: Children with combined visual and motor impairments

Lesson 7: Children with hearing loss: diagnosis, amplification, parent support

Lesson 8: Children with Hearing loss: communication

Lesson 9: Children with specific types of hearing loss

Lesson 10: Children with dual sensory loss (deaf-blind)

Lesson 11: Children who are medically fragile or have multiple diagnoses

Course Objectives: At the end of the course, students will have:

Become familiar with diagnoses that affect development, and the learning needs of children within this population;

Understood a theoretical framework of early intervention and learned to apply it to "best practice" guidelines that promote optimal development;

Learned to work collaboratively with families to identify and address the learning needs of children, within the context of family concerns and values; and

Developed a process for gathering and sharing information with families and community service providers.

Course Requirements
