Description

"Principles and practices of teachers and teacher-librarians planning and teaching the curriculum using the resources of the school library resource centre." (UBC Calendar) Cooperative program planning and teaching includes the participation of the teacher-librarian and the classroom teacher as partners in: the identification of learning objectives; the effective use of a wide range of resources; the implementation of a variety of instructional approaches; the development of appropriate methods of evaluation. LLED 469 is a core course on the Teacher Librarianship and Language and Literacy Education Diplomas.

Objectives for the online course

1. To develop an awareness of the educational role of the school library resource centre and the teacher-librarian;
2. To plan for the integration of the wide variety of learning resources available into curriculum units of study;
3. To identify principles and practices of cooperative planning and teaching in an interactive education model;
4. To identify teaching objectives and strategies which utilize resource centre materials in units of study.
5. To become an advocate for teacher-librarians and school library resource centre programs.
